

The Impact of COVID-19 on K-12 Education: Parts I & II

The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on public school education is undoubtedly substantial, though the full extent and variety of the effects are yet to be determined. As such, The institute is conducting a series of studies to explore these dynamics.

The first part of this analysis examines the approaches used by school districts in Lackawanna and Luzerne Counties to provide Continuity of Education following the mandated closure of all Pennsylvania schools in mid-March.

The second part of this analysis examines the approaches adopted by schools as they reopen in the fall as they reopened for the 2020-2021 academic year.

Regional Telehealth Services

While virtual medical visits are not new, the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have force medical professionals to add more and more virtual visits to their schedules—and forced patients to rethink how they seek access to medical care.

This research reveals many challenges to the provision of telehealth services, which remain apparent despite the current waivers and special considerations.

Recommended changes to these challenges can be tedious and potentially expensive, but telehealth is providing much needed help in a difficult time and, regardless of its drawbacks, will have the chance to grow and evolve as the field of medicine continues to make strides in the coming months and years.

Workforce Development in the Face of COVID-19

This report includes an analysis of unemployment claim activity by industry and demographics, and identifies which categories of workers have been most impacted by recent job losses.

Furthermore, this study describes likely postpandemic workforce changes in regard to automation, skills gaps, and unstable industries. It explores how workers can reskill, upskill, and outskill to enter industries or occupations that have not been as affected as their own. Recommendations are provided with the consideration that economic distress will cause further hardships for certain populations, industries, and occupations—and that these impacts will vary as the pandemic and economic recovery continue.


