Sneak Peek: What to Expect from the Latest Task Force Research

Health & Health Care: This study will explore data on child abuse and neglect in order to assess the scope of the problem and available resources. The report will also explore the broader public health implications of child abuse and neglect, identify shortages or gaps in services, and describe best practices or models to effectively prevent child abuse and neglect and mitigate its consequences.

Housing: To better understand this housing divide, the task force will analyze the regional housing market along with other socio-economic indicators (wages, debt, etc.) with a focus on those who struggle to afford housing. The analysis will consider issues such as homelessness, transitional housing issues, and housing needs of those leaving incarceration. Inventory, affordability trends (HUD data), and geographic patterns will be evaluated and used to identify recommendations for meeting regional housing needs.

Planning, Land Use, Transportation & Infrastructure: This report will consider the full build-out state of planned regional economic development projects in order to identify points of traffic congestion and consider impacts on transit utilization and bicycle/pedestrian infrastructure, as well as freight movement via road, rail, and air.

This research will include a congestion component evaluating predominant commute patterns, road counts, and pass-through truck traffic. It will consider planning and zoning, and identify opportunities for adaptive reuse and infill development in urban core to reduce congestion and meet demands of existing and planned land use patterns.

Jobs, Economy & Economic Development; Education & Workforce: Task forces will jointly develop a series of short research briefs on skills shortages, soft skills, labor demand, industrial automation, millennial workers, senior workers, job opportunities and higher education completions, and regional opportunities in the trades.


